## **Guidelines for making videos from your phone:**

- Landscape mode, not portrait (hold the phone or camera sideways)
- Have a product, logo or storefront in the shot
- Make sure there isn't a lot of noise in the background
- The light should be coming from in front to illuminate the face of the presenter
- The camera/cameraperson shouldn't be directly in front, which can cause a shadow on the presenter

# UPDATE on the EXPLORE EL SOBRANTE SWEEPSTAKES!


During September 2021, the El Sobrante Chamber of Commerce carried out its first ever **Explore El Sobrante** Program. ## ANNOUNCING THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE ELECTION for the 2022 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors has announced there will be an election conducted to seat a new Board of Directors for 2022. The slate of candidates will include both current board members and new nominees for a two year term beginning in January 2022. Chamber by-laws call for an election of the officers and half of the board to be elected each year. The remainder of the board will be comprised of members who have one year remaining on their term from the last election. Last year the board elected to suspend the election due to the shelter-in-place orders because of the Covid-19 virus pandemic.


The board will mail out ballots directly to all current and paid members of the Chamber in mid-November. Ballots are to be returned to the Chamber by the Due Date marked on the ballot (the date has not been confirmed by press time) and the winners of the election will be announced by email blast to all members as well as announced on the website and in the January newsletter.

If you are a fully paid member of the Chamber, watch your mail for the ballot. IF you have not paid your dues for 2021 you may do so now on the website via Paypal to be included in the voter pool. Chamber by-laws allow for only paid members to vote on the Board of Directors seats. Contact the chamber if you are unsure of your membership status before November 1st if you want to ensure you receive a ballot.

# Mortgage Minute

US Financial Mortgage Lending

**This month we will discuss the granddaddy of down payment assistance, the California Housing Finance Agency (CalHFA). For more than 40 years, CalHFA has supported the needs of renters and homebuyers by providing financing and programs so more low to moderate income Californians have a place to call home. Established in 1975, CalHFA was chartered as the state's affordable housing lender offering either below market interest rates or down payment assistance on FHA, VA, USDA and conventional loan.**

**Down Payment Assistance Program:** The money you put down or the down payment on your home loan can be one of the largest hurdles for many first-time homebuyers. That's why CalHFA offers several options for down payment and closing cost assistance. This type of assistance is often called a second or subordinate loan. CalHFA's subordinate loans are "silent seconds", meaning payments on this loan are deferred so you do not have to make a payment on this assistance until your home is sold, refinanced or paid in full. This helps to keep your monthly mortgage payment affordable.

## MyHome Assistance Program

FHA: MyHome offers a deferred-payment junior loan of an amount up to the lesser of 3.5% of the purchase price or appraised value to assist with down payment and/or closing costs, with a cap of \$15,000.

USDA, Conventional: MyHome offers a deferred-payment junior loan of an amount up to the lesser of 3% of the purchase price or appraised value to assist with down payment and/or closing costs, with a cap of \$15,000.

VA: MyHome offers a deferred-payment junior loan of an amount up to the lesser of 3% of the purchase price or appraised value to assist with down payment and/or closing costs.

Note that the \$15,000 cap does not apply to school employees and fire department employees, or those purchasing new construction homes, manufactured homes, or homes with ADUs.

## Homebuyer Education Requirement

One occupying first-time borrower on each loan transaction has to take a homebuyer education class. **ONLINE:** [eHome's eight-hour Homebuyer Education](#) and Counseling course is the only online course accepted by CalHFA. (fee: \$99) Other online courses like Frameworks are not acceptable because they do not provide a one-hour, 1-on-1 counseling follow-up session. **IN-PERSON or VIRTUAL:** Live Homebuyer Education and Counseling in-person or virtually through [NeighborWorks America](#) or any [HUD-Approved Housing Counseling Agency](#) (fee: varies by agency)



# EL SOBRANTE MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL (ESMAC)

Want to hear about what is going on in El Sobrante and provide input to County government on issues which you're concerned about? On the second Wednesday of each month, at 7PM, you are invited to join the meeting of the El Sobrante Municipal Advisory Council (ESMAC).

Meetings typically involve presentations by local law enforcement (Sheriff's office and Highway Patrol), the County Fire Protection District, and Supervisor John Gioia's office. There are always presentations on topics of interest to the whole community. At recent meetings of the ESMAC, among other topics, we discussed:

- Proposals for a park at the old Mowery Arco Station on San Pablo Dam Road
- The Envision Contra Costa 2040 project
- Wildfire protection plans in the El Sobrante Valley
- The proposed Artist Tree marijuana dispensary on San Pablo Dam Rd at La Colina
- County updates on the COVID-19 pandemic.

At every ESMAC meeting, members of the audience are encouraged to ask questions. There is always an Open Agenda section, where people can raise issues they are concerned about, and get input from Supervisor Gioia's office as well as other members of the community. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, meetings are held online via Zoom Link. Check the ESMAC website for the meeting agenda. If you click on the agenda, you will find the zoom link.




