### Mortgage Minute by Nicole Donn

With all the headlines and talk in the media about the **shift** in the housing market, you might be thinking this is a housing bubble. It's only natural for those thoughts that make you think it could be a repeat of what took place in 2008 to creep in. But the good news is, there's concrete data to show why this is nothing like the last time.

#### There's Still a Shortage of Homes on the Market Today, Not a Surplus

There were too many homes for sale during the 2008 housing crisis (many of which were short sales and foreclosures), and that caused prices to fall dramatically. <u>Supply</u> has increased since the start of this year, but there's still a shortage of inventory available overall, primarily due to almost 15 years of underbuilding homes. Today, unsold inventory sits at just a 3.2-months' supply at the current sales pace, which is significantly lower than the last time. There just isn't enough inventory on the market for <u>home prices</u> to come crashing down like they did last time, even though some overheated markets may experience slight declines.

#### Mortgage Standards Were Much More Relaxed Back Then

During the lead-up to the housing crisis, it was much easier to get a home loan than it is today. Running up to 2006, banks were creating artificial demand by lowering <u>lending</u> <u>standards</u> and making it easy for just about anyone to qualify for a home loan or refinance their current home.

Back then, lending institutions took on much greater risk in both the person and the mortgage products offered. That led to mass defaults, foreclosures, and falling prices. Today, things are different, and purchasers face much higher standards from mortgage companies.

#### The Foreclosure Volume Is Nothing Like It Was During the Crash

Another difference is the number of homeowners that were facing foreclosure after the housing bubble burst. Foreclosure activity has been lower since the crash, largely because buyers today are more qualified and less likely to default on their loans. In addition, homeowners today have options they just didn't have in the housing crisis when so many people owed more on their mortgages than their homes were worth. Today, many homeowners are <u>equity rich</u>. That equity comes, in large part, from the way home prices have appreciated over time

Right now, they're offering 20% off of everything. So stop by and give Ricky and Sam a visit. And tell them the El Sobrante Chamber of Commerce sent you.








### **BOOK SALE** Friends of the El Sobrante Library, April 1, 2023



### **CLOVERFIELD FARM IN APRIL**

#### What's Ready for U-Picking in April

The rains are abating and the sun is warming the soil and bringing back lush growth in the vegetable garden at Cloverfield Organic Farm. This year's rain and the weather will likely limit the quantity of our stone fruit harvest but our orchard trees are loving the extra moisture in the warming soil.. Our garden beds are bursting with items that may tempt you. It is still too early in the year to pick most of the fruits that we grow, but Summer is coming.

Things to be u-picked in April include kales, mustards, chard, green onions, green garlic, garlic chives, fava beans, lemon balm, lettuce, parsley, cilantro, ginger, dandelion greens, bay leaves, Greek oregano, chamomile, absinthe wormwood, epazote, asparagus, spinach, mint (apple, chocolate, & strawberry), beets, calendulas, nettles, arugula, and fennel. Towards the end of the month we hope to have some ripe strawberries and elderberry blossoms.

We have a selection of potted edible plants for sale, as well as dried herbs, seeds, raw honey, and extra-virgin organic olive oil in the farm shed. Our farm also makes a special location for a private tour, therapy horse interaction, picnic, or other event that can be arranged on our website, <u>www.cloverfieldfarm.us.</u> Visit us at 501 La Paloma Rd in El Sobrante.






